LPSSA TALKING POINTS FOR MEETING WITH CIVIC ASSOCIATIONS

<u>Betterment amount, interest rate (0-2%) and payback period (up to 20 or 30 years;</u> <u>has not been determined by Selectmen</u>. Hearing will be held later this year and a registered letter will be sent to all property owners. Final betterment rate must be fair to residential and non-residential bettered properties. Sewer service area (betterment area) is based upon properties that discharge to the lower Little Pond watershed adjusted by street location

<u>Betterment cost for single family residents is estimated at \$18,000/yr. (</u>\$600/yr. for 30 years @ 0% (\$804 yr. @ 2%) or \$900 yr. for 20 year @ 0 % (\$1091 @ 2%). Betterment costs may not be tax deductible. Please contact your tax advisor.

<u>One-time hook-up costs estimated at \$2500-\$4000</u>: Loan may be available from Barnstable County Department of Health & Environment's Community Septic Management Loan Program for both commercial and residential property owners. Please contact Kendall Ayers, 508.375.6877, kayers@barnstablecounty.org, www.barnstablecountysepticloan.org. <u>Property owner is responsible to connect their</u> <u>property to Town sewer at stub installed by Town at property line.</u>

<u>Full deferral of betterment payments</u>: For owners 65 years and older with limited income and property is principal residence. Please contact your tax advisor and Trish Favulli, Director of Assessing, <u>tfavulli@falmouthmass.us</u>, 508-495-7377)

<u>MA Senior Circuit Breaker Property Tax Credit</u>: For all Massachusetts residences 65 years of age and older, applicable to all Massachusetts residences (renters and owners) and property used as principal residence. Maximum amount is approximately \$1000 yr. even if no state tax is owed, contact your tax advisor.

<u>Massachusetts Personal Income Tax Credit</u>: For failed cesspool or septic system for principal residence only. Failed systems include those that have mandatory connections. Please contact your tax advisor.

<u>Eco-toilet Betterment Exemption or \$5,000 incentive:</u> Option for those willing to install compost or urine diverting toilets. Must connect all toilets, continued use of disposal field, disposal of compost/urine by licensed septic tank hauler, maintenance agreement and contract with Town, and deed restriction for continued use. Betterment must be repaid if connection to sewer is made at a later date. Check with health care provider regarding immunizations.
