CASINO WHARF FX

On Tuesday, June 5, the Casino Wharf FX went before the selectmen for permission to serve alcohol until 1am. Members of the Falmouth Heights-Maravista Improvement Association attended the meeting and urged the selectmen not to grant the extension of time due to the extra noise that will occur with two bars closing at the same time within feet of one another. Selectmen Carey Murphy and Kevin Murphy voted for the extended serving time, while Mary "Pat" Flynn and Brent Putnam voted against it. Chairmen, Ahmed Mustafa, broke the tie by voting for the late serving.

To date, none of the condominiums at the Casino have been sold; therefore, they have decided to rent several of the units.

Postcards were sent out last month informing you that the Casino Wharf FX will go before the Falmouth Zoning Board of Appeals (ZBA) on Thursday, July 10, to seek permission for entertainment on their decks, and to increase their seating capacity from 150 to 200 seats. Several of the Falmouth Heights-Maravista Improvement Association board members will attend that meeting to publicly state their concerns and request denial for outside entertainment. In a letter sent to the Falmouth ZBA, the Association stated that they do not object to the increase in seating as long as a fine dining establishment is maintained; however, the letter also states that we do object to any type of entertainment on their decks.

HARBORWATCH

Paula Lichter (FHMIA Board member) and DeeDee Mariano are the co-founders of HarborWatch. On behalf of HarborWatch. they have filed a lawsuit against the Falmouth Zoning Board of Appeals (ZBA) for granting administrative approval of MacDougall's request for 540' of an 8' tall solid white vinyl fence along Falmouth Heights Road and Grand Avenue without any public notice of their intent.

One section of this planned fence would measure 460' long and it would be in front of the almond building—leaving a 3' buffer from the fence and sidewalk. The second section of 80' fencing would extend from the north corner of the rigging loft to the driveway. HarborWatch feels that only 20' of coverage is needed to conceal the vellow HAZMAT containers. The addition 60' would block the breeze and view to the water.

HarborWatch would like to see MacDougall's landscape the entire area in the same attractive manner that they recently did at the north entrance of their property.

The Design Review Committee (DRC) and the town counsel believe this administrative approval is in opposition to the town's bylaws and that the request should have gone through the DRC for public review. To date, the ZBA has not withdrawn their approval of this fencing—they may be waiting for the legal suit to run its course.

LITTLE POND

Litigation is on hold for the present time. The developer has agreed to file an Environmental Impact Report (EIR) – which is a substantial analysis on the impact of the proposed development on this area.

RESURFACING BEACH PARKING LOT & NEW FENCE

The Falmouth D.P.W. will be working on the drainage problem on Grand Avenue. We are not sure when the resurfacing of the lot will begin; however, we are awaiting approval from ConCom. The new fence may be up before the summer.

SPRING CLEAN-UP WEEK

The annual spring clean-up week in Falmouth will be April 25 thru May 2, 2009. Please do your part in helping with this town-wide clean-up, which is sponsored by the Falmouth Beautification Council. There will be posters around town, as well as newspaper ads. Bags can be picked up at the Falmouth Rec. Center.

CASINO WHARF FX

In November 2008, the Casino Wharf FX went before the Zoning Board of Appeals (ZBA) to amend the valet parking rules. What follows is the revised schedule for valet parking, which also states that valet attendants shall be on duty any time there is a function of more than 50 people, and on major holidays.

May 1 - Labor Day: Valet attendants shall be on duty whenever the restaurant is open

Labor Day – October 15: Valet attendants shall be on duty all day on Saturday's and Sunday's. Valet attendants will be on duty every night from 4 p.m. until closing. The valet lot will be open and available for customers to self-park all day during the weekdays.

October 16 – December 31 & March 1 – April 30: Valet attendants shall be on duty Friday and Saturday nights, 4 p.m. until closing. The valet lot will not be open during the day.

January 1 – February 28: Valet attendants only on duty Friday and Saturday nights, 4 p.m. until closing. Valet lot not open during daytime.

It must be noted that the foregoing are minimal hours of operation. The Casino Wharf FX may extend the times valet parking is available, or when the valet parking area will be available for self-parking. The valet parking lot shall always be clear of cars as of 1 a.m. The restaurant shall also post the current schedule of valet parking inside the restaurant in a manner that will be readily seen by customers.

The mediation process was unsuccessful in trying to have the town and property owner come to a mutual solution, so the problem is now back in Land Court.

Paula Lichter and DeeDee Mariano are suing the Falmouth Zoning Board of Appeals as individuals—not on behalf of HarborWatch. The lawsuit against the Falmouth Zoning Board of Appeals (ZBA) is due to the fact that the ZBA granted administrative approval of MacDougall's request for 540' of an 8' tall solid white vinyl fence along Falmouth Heights Road and Grand Avenue without any public notice of their intent.

FALMOUTH HEIGHTS BEACH PARKING LOT & FENCE

MARAVISTA LITTLE BEACH

The problem continues to be in the Land Court. We have urged the town to more on our behalf to have a resolution of the encroachment on the beach.

SPEEDING AND TRAFFIC CONCERNS

Three members have banded together to work with the traffic advisory committee to insure enforcement of the stop signs, regulations and enforcement of the speed limit, and to address illegal parking problems. We will hear more from this group as they move forward.

FENCE ALONG MACDOUGALL'S
